



Nuclear Non-Proliferation and Export Control in the Republic of Croatia

In accordance with its internationally accepted obligations, the Republic of Croatia is actively implementing principles of non-proliferation and export control of nuclear materials and/or equipment.

The article deals with treaties, conventions, agreements and other international arrangements that are creating certain obligation for Republic of Croatia related to nuclear non-proliferation. The most important are the *Treaty on the Non-proliferation of Nuclear Weapons*, the *Convention on the Physical Protection of Nuclear Material*, the *Agreement between the Republic of Croatia and the International Atomic Energy Agency for the Application of Safeguards with Protocol*, the *Protocol Additional to the Agreement Between the Republic of Croatia and the International Atomic Energy Agency for the Application of Safeguards*, the *Comprehensive Nuclear Test-Ban Treaty*, the *NSG Guidelines for the Export of Nuclear Material, Equipment and Technology* and *NSG Guidelines for Transfers of Nuclear-Related Dual-Use Equipment, Materials, Software and Related Technology*.

In addition the article describes a national regulative framework, the basis for conducting activities in nuclear material control, export control of dual-use items as well as non-proliferation of the weapons of mass destruction. Details are given about the *Nuclear Safety Act*, the *Act on Liability for Nuclear Damage*, the *Act on Export of Dual-Use Items*, the *Decree on the List of Dual-Use Items*, the *Law on Production, Repair and Trade in Arms and Military Equipment* and the *Decree specifying goods subject to export and import licenses*.
