Any footnotes to a resolution appear immediately after the text at the left-hand side of the page; on the right-hand side are given the date of the adoption of the resolution, the relevant agenda item and a reference to the record of the meeting at which the resolution was adopted. The other decisions taken by the Conference are presented similarly.

## RESOLUTIONS

GC(XXXI)/RES/470

## ISRAELI NUCLEAR CAPABILITIES AND THREAT

The General Conference,

- (a) Having considered the agenda item "Israeli nuclear capabilities and threat",
- (b) Having also considered the Annual Report of the Agency for 1986, and in particular paragraphs 39, 40 and 41,
- (c) Recalling that the United Nations Security Council, in its resolution 487 of 1981, has called upon Israel to submit all its nuclear facilities to IAEA safeguards,
- (d) Noting that only Israel has been so called upon to comply with such an obligation by the Security Council,
- (e) Recalling United Nations General Assembly resolution 41/93 on Israeli Nuclear Armament, which, inter alia, called upon Israel to place all its nuclear facilities under IAEA safeguards and to renounce any possession of nuclear weapons,
- (f) Recalling the United Nations Secretary-General's reports on Israeli Nuclear Armament A/36/431 of 1981 and A/40/520 of 1985,
- (g) Taking note of the relevant resolutions of the United Nations General Assembly on co-operation between Israel and South Africa, particularly in the nuclear field, and
- (h) Deeply alarmed by recent information regarding the possession of nuclear weapons by Israel,

1. Demands that Israel place all its nuclear facilities under IAEA safeguards in compliance with Security Council resolution 487 of 1981;
2. Requests the Director General to consider implementation by the IAEA of provisions in United Nations General Assembly resolutions 41/12 and 41/93 in relation to the IAEA;
3. Requests the Director General to report to the Board of Governors and the next session of the General Conference on Israeli nuclear capabilities and threat and on the implementation of this resolution;

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4. Further requests the Director General to bring this resolution to the attention of the Secretary-General of the United Nations; and
5. Decides to include in the agenda for the thirty-second regular session of the General Conference an item entitled "Israeli nuclear capabilities and threat".

CONVENTION ON THE PHYSICAL PROTECTION OF  
NUCLEAR MATERIAL

The General Conference,

- (a) Recalling the resolutions adopted at its nineteenth, twenty-first, twenty-seventh, twenty-eighth, twenty-ninth and thirtieth regular sessions regarding the physical protection of nuclear material 1/,
  - (b) Recalling the adoption, in October 1979, of the Convention on the Physical Protection of Nuclear Material,
  - (c) Noting that to date there are 47 signatories and 21 ratifications of the Convention, and
  - (d) Noting that the Convention entered into force in February 1987,
1. Expresses its appreciation to the Director General for his report on the signature and ratification status and implementation of the Convention 2/;
  2. Continues to express the hope that the Convention will obtain the widest possible adherence; and
  3. Requests the Director General to report to the General Conference at its next regular session on the signature and ratification status of the Convention.

MEASURES TO STRENGTHEN INTERNATIONAL  
CO-OPERATION IN NUCLEAR SAFETY AND  
RADIOLOGICAL PROTECTION

The General Conference,

- (a) Recalling resolution GC(SPL.I)/RES/2 adopted by it last year at its special session and resolution GC(XXX)/RES/461 adopted at its thirtieth regular session,
- (b) Recalling also the requests made by it at its thirtieth regular session to the Director General concerning the Convention on the Physical Protection of Nuclear Material, the Convention on Early Notification of a Nuclear Accident and the Convention on Assistance in the Case of a Nuclear Accident or Radiological Emergency,
- (c) Recalling further the request made by it at its thirtieth regular session to the Director General concerning work under way within the Secretariat in the area of intervention dose levels,
- (d) Taking note of the report by the Board of Governors and the Director General contained in document GC(XXXI)/816 and prepared in response to resolution GC(SPL.I)/RES/2 and to the above-mentioned requests, and
- (e) Bearing in mind the long-term nature of the activities arising out of some of the statements and proposals made during its special session last year,
1. Expresses its appreciation of the work done by the Board of Governors and the Secretariat since its thirtieth regular session as reflected in document GC(XXXI)/816 and the relevant summary records of the Board's deliberations in December 1986 and February, June and September 1987;
  2. Requests the Board and the Secretariat to continue with the activities already initiated and to report on progress at the Conference's thirty-second regular session;
  3. Requests the Board to build on the experience already gained and continue to pursue initiatives proposed by Member States in the area of nuclear safety and radiological protection;
  4. Requests the Board to involve all interested Member States in the work which it will be undertaking pursuant to this resolution; and

5. Requests the Director General to transmit to the Board the summary records of the discussions in the Committee of the Whole and in the Conference's plenary meetings under the item "Measures to strengthen international co-operation in nuclear safety and radiological protection" together with supporting documentation in the form of draft resolutions submitted and resolutions adopted under this item at the Conference's thirty-first regular session.

SHARING OF NUCLEAR-SAFETY-RELATED INFORMATION

The General Conference,

- (a) Recognizing that nuclear power continues to be an important source of energy and is increasingly contributing to electricity generation in a number of countries,
- (b) Recognizing also that nuclear power has a potentially increasing role to play for the developing countries in their social and economic development,

(c) Convinced that States have the legitimate right to develop and use nuclear energy to meet their growing energy demands,

(d) Taking note of the common interest of all States in ensuring the safe operation of nuclear power plants and other nuclear facilities everywhere,

(e) Desiring to strengthen international co-operation in the safe development and use of nuclear energy,

(f) Appreciating the role of the IAEA in the area of nuclear safety and radiological protection, and

(g) Noting that the sharing of relevant information on nuclear safety for supplied facilities on a continuing, regular and assured basis between the supplier and the recipient is a necessary condition for the safe operation of those facilities,

1. Takes note of the discussion in the Board on this matter;
2. Urges the concerned supplier States to lend their full co-operation for an uninterrupted supply of relevant information on nuclear safety to the recipient States during the entire operational life of the nuclear facilities supplied by them;
3. Requests the Director General to intensify efforts to promote co-operation between States, particularly between supplier and recipient States, in the exchange of such information;
4. Appeals to the supplier States to co-operate with the Agency in the implementation of this resolution; and
5. Further requests the Director General to keep the Board and the General Conference informed about the progress in this regard.

PROTECTION OF NUCLEAR INSTALLATIONS  
AGAINST ARMED ATTACKS

The General Conference,

- (a) Recalling IAEA General Conference resolution GC(XXIX)/RES/444, and in particular its operative paragraphs 3 and 4,
- (b) Aware of the fact that an armed attack on a nuclear installation could result in radioactive releases with grave consequences within and beyond the boundaries of the State which has been attacked, and
- (c) Convinced of the need to prohibit armed attacks on nuclear installations from which such releases could occur and of the urgency of concluding an international agreement in this regard, and
- (d) Aware of the ongoing work of the Conference on Disarmament with a view to concluding an international agreement in this regard,
1. Takes note of the discussions in the Board on this matter;
  2. Authorizes the Director General to assist the work of the Conference on Disarmament and other competent international organs, at their request, by undertaking studies within the technical competence and statutory responsibilities of the Agency; and
  3. Requests the Director General to keep the Board and the General Conference informed about the progress in this regard.

the amounts in the appropriation sections to be adjusted in accordance with the adjustment formula presented in the Attachment in order to take into account the exchange rate variations during the year.

2. Decides that the foregoing appropriation shall be financed, after the deduction of revenues deriving from work for others (Section 9) and of other miscellaneous income of \$ 3 500 000 (representing \$ 564 000 plus AS 41 691 000), from contributions by Member States amounting, at an exchange rate of AS 14.20 to \$ 1.00, to \$ 129 137 000 (\$ 20 530 000 plus the equivalent in US dollars of AS 1 542 219 000), in accordance with the scale of assessment fixed by the General Conference in resolution GC(XXXI)/RES/479, each contribution to be adjusted in the light of the rate applicable at the date of payment; and
3. Authorizes the Director General:
  - (a) To incur expenditures additional to those for which provision is made in the Regular Budget for 1988, provided that the relevant emoluments of any staff involved and all other costs are entirely financed from revenues arising out of sales, work performed for Member States or international organizations, research grants, special contributions or other sources extraneous to the Regular Budget for 1988; and
  - (b) With the prior approval of the Board of Governors, to make transfers between any of the Sections listed in paragraph 1 above.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND CO-OPERATION FUND  
ALLOCATION FOR 1988The General Conference,

Accepting the recommendations of the Board of Governors relating to the Agency's technical assistance and co-operation programme for 1988;

1. Decides that for 1988 the target for voluntary contributions to the Technical Assistance and Co-operation Fund shall be \$38 000 000;
2. Notes that funds from other sources, estimated at \$1 million, are expected to be available for that programme;
3. Allocates the amount of \$39 000 000 for the Agency's technical assistance and co-operation programme for 1988; and
4. Urges all Member States to make voluntary contributions for 1988 in accordance with Article XIV.F of the Statute, with paragraph 2 of its Resolution GC(V)/RES/100 as amended by Resolution GC(XV)/RES/286 or with paragraph 3 of the former Resolution, as appropriate.

## THE WORKING CAPITAL FUND IN 1988

The General Conference,

Accepting the recommendations of the Board of Governors relating to the Agency's Working Capital Fund in 1988 [1],

1. Approves a level of \$2 000 000 for the Agency's Working Capital Fund in 1988;
2. Decides that the Fund shall be financed, administered and used in 1988 in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Agency's Financial Regulations [2];
3. Authorizes the Director General to make advances from the Fund:
  - (a) Not exceeding \$25 000 at any time, to finance temporarily projects or activities of a strictly self-liquidating character which will not necessitate an increase in the Fund in future years; and

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(b) With the prior approval of the Board of Governors, unless in his opinion the situation requires immediate action before such approval can be obtained, to meet the cost incurred by the Agency in organizing and rendering emergency assistance to Member States in connection with radiation accidents, up to \$50 000 in each case; and

4. Requests the Director General to submit to the Board statements of advances made from the Fund under the authority given in paragraph 3 above.

SCALE OF ASSESSMENT OF MEMBERS'  
CONTRIBUTIONS FOR 1988

The General Conference,

Applying the principles it has established for the assessment of Members' contributions towards the Agency's Regular Budget [1],

1. Decides that Members' individual base rates and assessments in respect of the Agency's Regular Budget for 1988 shall be as set forth in the Annex hereto; and

2. Determines, pursuant to Financial Regulation 6.08 [2], that in the event of a State becoming a Member of the Agency during the remainder of 1987 or in 1988 it shall be assessed as appropriate:

(a) For an advance or advances to the Working Capital Fund, in accordance with Financial Regulation 7.03 [3]; and

(b) For a contribution or contributions towards the Agency's Regular Budget, in accordance with the principles the Conference has established for that purpose.

Resolves to consider and take a decision on the recommendation of the Board of Governors contained in its report GC(XXXI)/807 to suspend South Africa from the exercise of the privileges and rights of membership in accordance with Article XIX.B of the Statute, at the thirty-second regular session of the General Conference;
2. Requests the Director General to continue to take all possible measures to ensure the full implementation of resolution GC(XXX)RES/468 and report to the thirty-second regular session of the General Conference in this regard;
3. Requests the Director General to bring this resolution to the attention of the Secretary-General of the United Nations; and
4. Decides to include in the agenda of the thirty-second regular session of the General Conference an item entitled "South Africa's nuclear capabilities".
