the amounts in the appropriation sections to be adjusted in accordance with the adjustment formula presented in the Attachement in order to take into account the exchange rate variations during the year;

2. **Decides** that the foregoing appropriation shall be financed, after the deduction of revenues deriving from work for others (Section 9) and of other miscellaneous income of US \$4 565 000 (representing US \$1 165 000 plus AS 66 300 000), from contributions by Member States amounting, for an exchange rate of AS 19.50 to US \$1.00, to US \$95 909 000 (US \$24 601 000 plus the equivalent in US dollars of AS 1 390 506 000), in accordance with the scale of assessment fixed by the General Conference in resolution GC(XXX)/RES/463, each contribution to be adjusted in the light of the rate applicable at the date of payment; and

3. **Authorizes** the Director General:

- (a) To incur expenditures additional to those for which provision is made in the Regular Budget for 1987, provided that the relevant emoluments of any staff involved and all other costs are entirely financed from revenues arising out of sales, work performed for Member States of international organizations, research grants, special contributions or other sources extraneous to the Regular Budget for 1987; and
- (b) With the prior approval of the Board of Governors, to make transfers between any of the Sections listed in paragraph 1 above.

**TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND
CO-OPERATION FUND
ALLOCATION FOR 1987**

The General Conference,

Accepting the recommendations of the Board of Governors relating to the Agency's technical assistance and co-operation programme for 1987;

1. **Decides** that for 1987 the target for voluntary contributions to the Technical Assistance and Co-operation Fund shall be US \$34 000 000;
2. **Notes** that funds from other sources, estimated at US \$1 million, are expected to be available for that programme;
3. **Allocates** the amount of US \$35 000 000 for the Agency's technical assistance and co-operation programme for 1987; and
4. **Urges** all Member States to make voluntary contributions for 1987 in accordance with Article XIV.F of the Statute, with paragraph 2 of its Resolution GC(V)/RES/100 as amended by Resolution GC(XV)/RES/286 or with paragraph 3 of the former Resolution, as appropriate.

THE WORKING CAPITAL FUND IN 1987

The General Conference,

Accepting the recommendations of the Board of Governors relating to the Agency's Working Capital Fund in 1987 [1],

1. **Approves** a level of US \$2 million for the Agency's Working Capital Fund in 1987;
2. **Decides** that the Fund shall be financed, administered and used in 1987 in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Agency's Financial Regulations [2];
3. **Authorizes** the Director General to make advances from the Fund:
 - (a) Not exceeding US \$25 000 at any time, to finance temporarily projects or activities of a strictly self-liquidating character which will not necessitate an increase in the Fund in future years; and
 - (b) With the prior approval of the Board of Governors, unless in his opinion the situation requires immediate action before such approval can be obtained, to meet the cost incurred by the Agency in organizing and rendering emergency assistance to Member States in connection with radiation accidents, up to US \$50 000 in each case; and
4. **Requests** the Director General to submit to the Board statements of advances made from the Fund under the authority given in paragraph 3 above.

**CONVENTION ON THE PHYSICAL
PROTECTION OF NUCLEAR MATERIAL**

The General Conference,

- (a) **Recalling** the resolutions adopted at its nineteenth, twenty-first, twenty-seventh, twenty-eighth and twenty-ninth regular sessions regarding the physical protection of nuclear material [1],
 - (b) **Recalling** the adoption in October 1979 of the Convention on the Physical Protection of Nuclear Material, and
 - (c) **Noting** that to date there are 46 signatories and 18 ratifications of the Convention,
1. **Expresses** its appreciation to the Director General for his report on the signature and ratification status of the Convention [2];
 2. **Continues** to express the hope that the Convention will enter into force at the earliest possible date and that it will obtain the widest possible adherence; and
 3. **Requests** the Director General to report to the General Conference at its next regular session on the signature and ratification status of the Convention.

The General Conference,

- (a) **Recalling** its resolutions embodying principles for the assessment of Members' contributions towards the safeguards component of the Agency's Regular Budget [1] and the operative paragraph of resolution GC(XXIX)/RES/449, and
 - (b) **Having considered** the Board's recommendation in document GC(XXX)/786 to continue with the current arrangements for a further three years,
1. **Decides** that the arrangements for the assessment of Members' contributions towards the safeguards component of the Agency's Regular Budget which it approved by resolution GC(XXVII)/RES/416 to supplement those contained in resolutions GC(III)/RES/50 and GC(XXI)/RES/351 and which, pursuant to General Conference resolution GC(XXVIII)/RES/433, continued to be applicable for 1985 and 1986 shall continue further to be applicable for 1987, 1988 and 1989; and
 2. **Further decides** that the Board shall review these arrangements, initiating appropriate consultations immediately after the end of the thirtieth regular session of the General Conference, and make a recommendation to the General Conference at its regular session in 1989 at the latest on arrangements to be applicable thereafter.

**SCALE OF ASSESSMENT OF MEMBERS'
CONTRIBUTIONS FOR 1987**

The General Conference,

Applying the principles it has established for the assessment of Members' contributions towards the Agency's Regular Budget [1],

1. **Decides** that Members' individual base rates and assessments in respect of the Agency's Regular Budget for 1987 shall be as set forth in the Annex hereto; and
2. **Determines**, pursuant to Financial Regulation 6.08 [2], that in the event of a State becoming a Member of the Agency during the remainder of 1986 or in 1987 it shall be assessed as appropriate:
 - (a) For an advance or advances to the Working Capital Fund, in accordance with Financial Regulation 7.03 [3]; and
 - (b) For a contribution or contributions towards the Agency's Regular Budget, in accordance with the principles the Conference has established for that purpose.

- (a) **Taking note** with appreciation of the report submitted by the Director General (document GC(XXX)/782) on the implementation of General Conference resolution GC(XXV)/RES/386,
 - (b) **Taking into account** resolution GC(XXIX)/RES/453 adopted by the General Conference at its twenty-ninth regular session,
 - (c) **Considering** that the representation of developing countries, particularly at the senior and policy-making levels, in the Agency's Secretariat remains inadequate,
 - (d) **Convinced** that further steps are required to rectify the existing imbalance,
 - (e) **Convinced** also that the implementation of this resolution does not affect the representation of any particular area, and
 - (f) **Noting with satisfaction** the Agency's programme for training young professionals from developing countries,
1. **Commends** the efforts of the Director General and the steps he has taken to increase the number of staff members drawn from developing countries in accordance with General Conference resolution GC(XXV)/RES/386;
 2. **Requests** the Director General in keeping with the Statute to take further specific steps to increase adequately the number of staff members at all levels drawn from developing countries, particularly at the senior and policy-making levels, in the course of the next three years, taking due account of the need for equitable geographical distribution; and
 3. **Requests** the Director General to report annually on the continuing implementation of General Conference resolution GC(XXV)/RES/386 to the Board of Governors and to the General Conference.

SOUTH AFRICA'S NUCLEAR CAPABILITIES

The General Conference,

- (a) **Having considered** the annual report of the Agency for 1985 (GC(XXX)/775) and the report of the Board of Governors on South Africa's nuclear capabilities (GC(XXX)/785),
 - (b) **Recalling** United Nations General Assembly resolutions 40/89 A and B on implementation of the Declaration on the Denuclearization of Africa and the nuclear capability of South Africa, General Assembly resolution 40/64 A on the apartheid policies of South Africa, and resolutions 40/97 A-F on the situation in Namibia resulting from the illegal occupation of the territory by South Africa,
 - (c) **Alarmed** that South Africa's unsafeguarded nuclear facilities have enabled it to develop and acquire the capability of producing fissionable material for nuclear weapons,
 - (d) **Stressing** that the acquisition of nuclear weapon capability by the racist régime constitutes a very grave danger to international peace and security and, in particular, jeopardizes the security of African States and increases the danger of the proliferation of nuclear weapons,
 - (e) **Bearing in mind** that South Africa is strengthening her nuclear capabilities partly through the illegal acquisition of Namibian uranium, and
 - (f) **Stressing**, that despite the requests of the General Conference and the international community, South Africa has persistently violated international law as well as the purposes and principles of the United Nations, upon which the IAEA's activities are based in accordance with Article III.B.1 of the Statute,
1. **Takes note** of United Nations General Assembly resolutions 40/89 A and B, 40/79 A-F, 40/415, 40/57, 40/64 E and 40/168 A and of General Conference document GC(XXX)/775;
 2. **Takes note** with regret of the report by the Director General of the IAEA on the failure of South Africa to submit all its nuclear facilities to Agency safeguards;
 3. **Takes note** of document GC(XXX)/785, which indicates in paragraph 119 of Annex 2 that "the Board agreed to transmit to the regular session of the General Conference the records of its discussions under that item since September 1985, together with the report of the Director General contained in document GOV/INF/502, to enable the General Conference to decide in terms of operative paragraph 14 of General Conference resolution GC(XXIX)/RES/442, adopted in 1985, on the appropriate action to be taken on that matter in accordance with the Statute";
 4. **Demands once again** that South Africa urgently submit forthwith all its nuclear installations and facilities to Agency safeguards;
 5. **Calls upon** all Member States which have not yet done so to halt all nuclear co-operation with the racist régime of South Africa and, in particular, to end any assistance concerning the nuclear fuel cycle and the transfer of technology and all purchases of uranium from South Africa and to terminate forthwith all nuclear research contracts with South Africa;
 6. **Requests** Member States to take all necessary measures to prevent any nuclear collaboration by all corporations and enterprises within and under their jurisdiction with South Africa;

7. **Calls upon** the Agency and Member States to refrain from participating in any expert meetings, panels, conferences or seminars in South Africa;
8. **Demands** that South Africa stop immediately the plundering and illegal mining, utilization, exploitation and sale of Namibian uranium;
9. **Calls upon** the Agency's Member States, particularly those whose corporations are involved in the mining and processing of Namibian uranium, to take all appropriate measures in compliance with United Nations resolutions and decisions and with Decree No. 1 for the protection of the natural resources of Namibia, including the practice of requiring negative certificates of origin, to prohibit State-owned and other corporations, together with their subsidiaries, from dealing in Namibian uranium and from engaging in any uranium-prospecting activities in Namibia;
10. **Calls once again upon** all Member States which have not yet done so to stop all purchases of Namibian uranium;
11. **Considers** that the continuation of South Africa's policies in disregard and in violation of the purposes and principles of the United Nations, upon which, in accordance with Article III.B of the Statute, the Agency's activities are based, constitutes a persistent violation of the provisions of the Statute within the meaning of Article XIX.B;
12. **Requests** the Board of Governors to consider recommending the suspension of South Africa from the exercise of the privileges and rights of membership in accordance with Article XIX.B of the Statute at the thirty-first session of the General Conference if, by that time, South Africa has not complied with the relevant General Conference resolutions and conducted itself in accordance with the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations; and
13. **Requests** the Director General to bring this resolution to the attention of the Secretary-General of the United Nations.
